The Season of Creation is a relatively new addition to the church year, training us as responsible peacemakers and partners in the health of God's Earth. Whatever you do, and however much or little you do, make all of it count, and seek out the potential for motivation and meaning: lip-service and "just going through the motions" reflects ingratitude for such opportunities passed on through many generations of a global family gathered through the shared "blood" of Christ. The prophet Ezekiel affirms both the deadly seriousness of chosen injustice and the transformational value of changing course, even when it seems too late. In Romans, Paul continues to work on the moral quality and integrity of the worshiping, witnessing community: fellowship and mutual love are the foundations of effective action. This continues in Matthew 18 into the extraordinary care to be shown in church discipline, noting how harmful attitudes and actions left unattended can disrupt the entire community—and yet how a beloved yet wayward member should not simply be sacrificed "for the common good." Be proud of this heritage. And don't be afraid to assert it against less loving ways.



THE HEBREW SCRIPTURES

Ezekiel 33:7–11

The reading is introduced.

A reading from the book of the prophet Ezekiel.

"Now you, mere mortal, I make you the sentinel for the House of Israel. Whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you must give my warning. If I say to evildoers, 'You will surely die,' and you do not warn them to turn from their ways, the evildoers will die because of their sin, but I will hold you responsible for their deaths. But if you warn evildoers to turn from their sin, they will die for their sins, but you will have saved your life.

"Now then, mere mortal, say to the House of Israel, 'You've been saying things like this, complaining, "We are burdened by our sins and our offenses, and we waste away because of them. How can we survive?" Say to them, 'As I live, says Sovereign YHWH, I take no pleasure in the death of sinners— I prefer that they turn from their ways and live. Turn back! Turn back from your evil ways! Why should you die, House of Israel?"

PSALM 119:33–40 Legem pone

- Teach me, O God, the way of your statutes, * and I shall keep it to the end.

- Fulfill your promise to your servant, * which you make to those who fear you.
- Turn away the reproach which I dread, * because your judgments are good.
- Behold, I long for your commandments; * in your righteousness preserve my life.
- Glory to God, Source of All Being, Incarnate Word and Holy Spirit; * as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

THE CHRISTIAN SCRIPTURES

Romans 13:8-14

The reading is introduced. A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans.

Owe no debt to anyone—except the debt that binds us to love one another. If you love your neighbor, you have fulfilled the Law. The commandments—no committing adultery, no killing, no stealing, no coveting, and all the others—are all summed up in this one: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love never wrongs anyone—hence love is the fulfillment of the Law.

Besides, you know the time in which we are living. It is now the hour for you to wake from sleep, for our salvation is closer than when we first accepted the faith. The night is far spent; the day draws near. So let us cast off deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us live honorably as in daylight, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual excess and lust, not in quarreling and jealousy.

Rather, clothe yourselves with our Savior Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the night.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

Matthew 18:15–20

The Holy Gospel is announced. The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Christ.**

[Jesus said,] "If your sibling should commit some wrong against you, go and point out the error, but keep it between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won a loved one back; if not, try again, but take one or two others with you, so that every case may stand on the word of two or three witnesses. If your sibling refuses to listen to them, refer the matter to the church. If they ignore even the church, then treat that sibling as you would a Gentile or a tax collector.

"The truth is, whatever you declare bound on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you declare loosed on earth will be loosed in heaven.

"Again I tell you, if two of you on earth join in agreement to pray for anything whatsoever, it will be granted you by my Abba God in heaven. Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst."

For all who suffer or are in any distress or grief, that they may be sustained by your abiding presence and comforted by our care, especially the people of Maui, Mike, Liz, and Miles, Kathy, Sarah and family, Dominique and family, Diana, the Holbrook family, Katherine and David, Carol and family, Jim and Claire, and those we name aloud or in silence. (Pause) Abiding Comforter, we trust in you and pray:

Let justice and peace flow.

For those we love who have entered into larger life, especially Jimmy, Howard, and those we name in silence or aloud (pause), and for those who grieve. Gentle Receiver of all who pass into larger life, we hold this hope and prav:

Let justice and peace flow.

We bring all these prayers to you, Abba God, Ground of our being and Source of our vision. Amen.

THE CONFESSION OF SIN

Let us confess to God our sins against the creation.

Silence for reflection.

We confess that we have not paid attention to the whole of creation. In our concern for our own species, we have trampled others. We have not understood how our actions influence the lives of bugs, birds, and fish. We have elevated our existence over that of bears, whales, and dragonflies. We have ignored our scientists and pushed aside the concerns of our children. We beg forgiveness from future peoples. We beg forgiveness from our sibling species with whom we share this planet. God of creation, have mercy on us and help us. Turn us, change us, and heal us, that we might be good siblings and generous partners with creation. Amen.

Almighty God have mercy on you, +forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

Have mercy, O God, for we are sinners in your sight.



The Celebrant continues:

And so, Abba God, we who have been redeemed by Christ, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, Jesus took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Remembering now Christ's work of redemption, and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving, we celebrate Christ's death and resurrection, as we await the day of Christ's coming.

Lord God of our Ancestors: God of Abraham and Sarah, God of Isaac and Rebekah, and God of Jacob, Rachel, and Leah; God of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in Christ's name.

Risen One, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.



and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

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


The Breaking of the Bread and Fraction Anthem (7:45)

The Invitation to Communion**

Jesus invites you to this Table. Come, eat and live.

Please sit. Jesus welcomed everyone to his table, and so we at St. Barnabas welcome everyone to this table. Gather around the Altar as you are directed. You may stand or kneel as is your custom. The Celebrant will place the gluten-free bread into your hand. You have two options to receive the wine. A Chalice Bearer will offer the Common Cup from which you may drink, or you may dip the bread in the wine when a second chalice comes in turn. You may also choose not to partake of the Cup. When you have received the Sacrament, please return to your seat. If you or your children prefer only to receive a blessing, please indicate this by crossing your hands over your chest.


N., in the name of this congregation, I send you forth bearing these holy gifts that those to whom you go may share with us the communion of Christ's Body and Blood.
