THE HEBREW SCRIPTURES Isaiah 45:1–7

The reading is introduced. A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

"Thus says YHWH to the Anointed One, Cyrus, whom I have taken by the right hand, for whom I have subdued nations, stripped the loins of monarchs, and thrown open all doors so that even the town gates cannot be shut:

I will go before you and level the mountains; I will shatter the bronze doors and cut through the bars of iron.

I will give you the hidden treasures, and hoards from secret places, so that you may know that I am YHWH, Israel's God, who calls you by name.

For the sake of Leah and Rachel and Jacob, my Servant, and for the sake of Israel, my chosen one, I called you by name, conferring on you an honored title, even though you do not know me.

I am YHWH, and there is no other; there is no God besides me. It is I who arm you, though you know me not, that nations may know from the rising to the setting of the sun that there is no one besides me. I am YHWH, there is no other.

I form light and create darkness. I make peace and create evil. It is I , YHWH, who do all these things.

A brief silence, then: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. **Thanks be to God.**

PSALM 96:1–9 Cantate Domino

The psalm is prayed in unison.

- Sing to God a new song; sing to God all the whole earth.

- Declare God's glory among the nations, * God's wonders among all peoples
- For God is great and greatly to be praised, * more to be feared than all gods.

- Oh, the majesty and the magnificence of God's presence! * Oh, the power and the splendor of God's sanctuary!
- Ascribe due honor to God's holy Name; * bring offerings and come into God's courts.
- Worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness; * let the whole earth tremble before God.
- Glory to God, Source of All Being, Incarnate Word and Holy Spirit; * as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

THE CHRISTIAN SCRIPTURES / Thessalonians 1:1–10

The reading is introduced. A reading from Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians.

From Paul, Silas And Timothy, to the people of the church in Thessalonica, who belong to Abba God and our Savior Jesus Christ: May grace and peace be yours.

We always thank God for all of you and remember you in our prayers. We call to mind before our God and Creator how you are proving your faith by your actions, laboring in love, and showing constancy of hope in our Savior Jesus Christ.

We know, beloved of God, that you have been chosen. Our preaching of the Gospel was not a mere matter of words. It was done in the power of the Holy Spirit and with complete conviction. You know very well the sort of life we led when we were with you, which was for your sake.

You, in turn, followed the example set by us and by Jesus—receiving the word, despite great trials, with the joy that comes from the Holy Spirit. In this way, you've become a model for all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia.

The word of Christ has been resounding from you—and not only in Macedonia and Achaia: the news of your faith in God is celebrated everywhere, which makes it unnecessary for us to say anything more. They themselves report to us what kind of reception we had among you, how you turned from idols to God, to be faithful witnesses of the living and true God, and to await the appearance from heaven of Jesus, the Only Begotten, whom God raised from the dead and who will deliver us from the wrath to come.

THE HOLY GOSPEL Matthew 22:15–22

The Holy Gospel is announced. The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Christ.**

Then the Pharisees went off and began to plot how they might trap Jesus by his speech. They sent their disciples to Jesus, accompanied by sympathizers of Herod, who said, "Teacher, we know you're honest and teach God's way sincerely. You court no one's favor and don't act out of respect for important people. Give us your opinion, then, in this case. Is it lawful to pay tax to the Roman emperor, or not?"

Jesus recognized their bad faith and said to them, "Why are you trying to trick me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin which is used to pay the tax." When they handed Jesus a small Roman coin, Jesus asked them, "Whose head is this, and whose inscription?" "Caesar's," they replied. At that, Jesus said to them, "Then give to Caesar what is Caesar's, but give to God what is God's."

When they heard this, they were astonished and went away.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

It is our custom to light candles for those who are sick or distressed and to remember those who have died. The prayer stations are on either side of the Altar. The refrain* is sung once.

We pray for the earth and all its inhabitants. Protect lands at risk of wildfire and heal dying forests. Where fire brings destruction, raise up new growth. Guide us in tending precarious ecosystems. Hear us, O God. **Your mercy is great.**

We pray for those who govern our nations, tribes, and cities. Open them to the cries of people in need. Direct them in shaping policies that prioritize the health and well-being of all who struggle with hunger and housing insecurity. Hear us, O God.

Your mercy is great.

We pray for all who are ill, all who are lonely or anxious, and all who grieve, especially Ann, Dave, the Shable family, the Wier family, Faith, Jeanne, John and Patrice, Judy, the people of Ukraine, the people of Afghanistan, the people of Israel and Gaza, and those we name aloud or in silence. (*Pause*) Draw them close to you and soothe them with the promise of your enduring love. Hear us, O God. **Your mercy is great.**

We remember our beloved dead, who with the great cloud of witnesses bear witness to your saving grace; especially those we name aloud or in silence. *(Pause)* Accompany us on our pilgrimage of faith, that we too place our hope and trust in you. Hear us, O God.

Your mercy is great.

We entrust these and all our prayers to you, Holy God, in the Name of your beloved Child, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

The refrain is sung once more.





The Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O God,

We remember Christ's death, We proclaim Christ's resurrection, We await Christ's coming in glory.

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Maker of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, through whom we

are acceptable to you, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the blessed Virgin Mary, blessed Barnabas, and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **Amen**.



now and for ever. Amen.


The Lord's Prayer (9:30)*




The Invitation to Communion**

Jesus invites you to this Table. Come, eat and live.

Please sit. Jesus welcomed everyone to his table, and so we at St. Barnabas welcome everyone to this table. Gather around the Altar as you are directed. You may stand or kneel as is your custom. The Celebrant will place the gluten-free bread into your hand. You have two options to receive the wine. A Chalice Bearer will offer the Common Cup from which you may drink, or you may dip the bread in the wine when a second chalice comes in turn. You may also choose not to partake of the Cup. When you have received the Sacrament, please return to your seat. If you or your children prefer only to receive a blessing, please indicate this by crossing your hands over your chest.
